HISTORICAL INTEREST SITE

Members of the Redmond Historical Landmarks Commission toured the building on Thursday September 8, 2011 for the purpose of determining the future plans for the building.

Several points that I would like to present to the commission for consideration for a presentation to the Redmond City Council as they make their final decision of the building.

- ❖ It appears that the building could stay at the present location and still allow a parking lot to be developed for the future activities planned by the Parks Commission in the Canyon.
- ❖ Building is not stable enough to be moved to a new site. Also the overhead wires and trees are very prohibitive to a move.
- ❖ Building does have historical value that should be preserved.
- ❖ Renovation of the building would then allow its use as a commercial business as an additional attraction to other developments for public use of the Canyon. Example: coffee shop – gift/art shop, etc.
- ❖ Recommendation to preserve, ask Parks Commission for further consideration as a change in their plan for development of that site, and ask that Council action allow the building to remain on current site for future renovation.
