**A. Employee Spotlight, Dave Hudson**

Public Works Director Bill Duerden presented an Employee Spotlight on Public Works Transportation Division Operations Supervisor Dave Hudson who will be retiring soon. Mr. Hudson has worked at the City since August 1, 1978. In addition to his job at Public Works, Mr. Hudson was also a volunteer firefighter/EMT for 11 years retiring as a Captain and a Police Reserve for 20 years where he was also an instructor for the Central Oregon Reserve Law Enforcement and Firearms. Mr. Duerden recognized Mr. Hudson for his numerous contributions to public service as well as his wife Cheryl for her support. Mr. Hudson accepted a recognition plaque from the Council.

**B. Redmond Commission for Art in Public Places Annual Update, Heather Richards**

Community Development Director Heather Richards introduced Redmond Commission for Art in Public Places (RCAPP) Chair Linda Hill who provided the Council with an annual report. RCAPP's 2013 accomplishments include the following:
